Report to Parents 2019-2020



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School Improvement Goals

Improve ELA and math growth with an emphasis on rigor

- Implementing Edmentum (i.e. Exact Path, Study Island) to target student growth and tailor instruction and remediation to meet students' needs.
- MAP tests were administered to all students three times to identify and monitor strengths/weaknesses in ELA and Mathematics.
- Teachers collaborate weekly in Professional Learning Communities (PLCs) to analyze and review data to drive best instructional practices.

Improve performance of students with special needs in all academic areas.

- Staff will ensure that IEPs are written based on individualized student needs.
- Testing data will be utilized to individualize instruction.
- Mainstreaming opportunities will be provided through co-teaching.

Improve parental involvement and satisfaction

- All ProDad, PTO, SIC meetings, and other community events, such as Taco Tuesday and 6th Grade Parent Orientation, will be offered.
- Survey 6th and 7th Grade parents to facilitate a seamless transition to middle school for incoming students. There will be an emphasis on vertical alignment.
- Sponsor Parent Universities that provide parents with tools to best guide their students through the middle school years.

Plans for 2020-2021

Literacy Plan

Literacy will remain a focus through the monitoring and adjustment of a comprehensive literacy plan, including RTI (Response to Intervention). The plan will ensure continuity for all grade levels and subjects.

Project Lead the Way

By designing mobile apps, 3D models, and therapeutic toys, and by programming robots, students in Project Lead the Way classes focus on authentic applications of Science Technology Engineering and Mathematics concepts. Classes are offered in Automation and Robotics, Energy and the Environment, Flight and Space, Design and Modeling, Medical Detectives, Green Architecture, and App Creator. This program is continuously developing and improving the curriculum.

One-to-One Technology Implementation

With the implementation of 1:1 technology across KCSD, the digital convergence framework will continue to be implemented throughout LEMS. Teachers will continue using best practices, such as blended learning and station rotations.

PBIS/SPOT

Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports are continually used as we improve behavior at LEMS. Using the SPOT framework (Show respect, Practice safety, Organize yourself, and Take responsibility), discipline referrals have declined. Interventions will continue with quarterly celebrations, school wide training, and individualized student training. Our Check In Check Out program has shown progress with students who benefit from having a mentor and self reflection protocol. Our Perfect Picnic allows students who have had no discipline referrals for the year to participate in an all day event sponsored by members of the community. This event grows yearly.
