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School Improvement Goals

Improve ELA state test scores with an emphasis on literacy

- SPOT schedule was used to focus on literacy and math skills based on MAP results and weaknesses in student performance.
- MAP tests were administered to all students twice a year to determine strengths/weaknesses in ELA and Mathematics.
- All teachers incorporated writing across the curriculum.

Improve performance of students with special needs in all academic areas.

- Staff will ensure that IEPs are written based on individualized student needs.
- Testing data will be utilized to individualize instruction.
- Mainstreaming opportunities will be provided through co-teaching.

Improve parental involvement

 All Pro Dads, PTO and SIC meetings and other community events such as Turkey Supper and Parent Universities will be offered.

Plans for 2015-2016

Literacy Plan

Literacy will remain a focus through the development of a comprehensive literacy plan, including RTI (Response to Intervention). The plan will ensure continuity for all grade levels and subjects.

New South Carolina Math and ELA Standards

Teachers will prepare lessons and assessments that are aligned with the new SC College and Career Ready Standards. In math, students will be exposed to higher order thinking skills and advanced mathematic concepts. In ELA, students will write argumentative essays, develop listening skills, and become stronger speakers.

PBIS/SPOT

We will continue with Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports as we use SPOT to improve behaviors at LEMS. SPOT is an acronym for **S**how respect, **P**ractice safety, **O**rganize yourself, and **T**ake responsibility. Through SPOT, discipline referrals were reduced by 53% over a three year period. Tier II interventions will continue with celebrations, quarterly training, and individualized student training.

Co-Teaching

We will continue with co-teaching in the Reading and Mathematics curriculum. We will increase the number of classes to expand the opportunity for the special needs populations to be mainstreamed.
