School Improvement Goals

Improve ELA and math growth with an emphasis on rigor

- Implementation of Literacy and Math Design Collaborative to ensure best practices in literacy and math.
- MAP tests were administered to all students three times to identify and monitor strengths/weaknesses in ELA and Mathematics.
- All teachers incorporated text-dependent writing across the disciplines.

Improve performance of students with special needs in all academic areas.

- Staff will ensure that IEPs are written based on individualized student needs.
- Testing data will be utilized to individualize instruction.
- Mainstreaming opportunities will be provided through co-teaching.

Improve parental involvement and satisfaction

- All ProDad, PTO, and SIC meetings and other community events such as Turkey Supper and 6th Grade Parent Orientation will be offered.
- Survey all 6th and 7th Grade parents about the transition to middle school and to the seventh grade in order to make improvements.

Plans for 2018-2019

Literacy Plan

Literacy will continue to be a focus through the monitoring and adjustment of a comprehensive literacy plan, including RTI (Response to Intervention), encouraging independent reading to strengthen comprehension, and providing instruction on written responses to text within all grade levels and subjects...

Project Lead the Way

Project Lead the Way classes will focus on authentic applications of Science Technology Engineering and Mathematics concepts. Classes are offered in Automation and Robotics, Design and Modeling, Introduction to Computer Science, Medical Detectives, and Energy and Environment. The program will expand to include Green Architecture and Flight and Space.

Social Climate

Parent, student, teacher, and community satisfaction with the social and physical environment of our school will be a priority. Opportunities for conferences, collaboration, and activities for continual improvements in our school will be provided.

PBIS/SPOT

We will continue with Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports as we use SPOT to improve behaviors at LEMS. SPOT is an acronym for Show respect, Practice safety, Organize yourself, and Take responsibility. Through SPOT, discipline referrals were reduced by 55% over a four year period. Tier II interventions will continue with celebrations, training each semester, and individualized student interventions.
