

## History Of Our School

LES, the first all-electric elementary school in Kershaw County, was dedicated in August 1967. The original building, which was built to house 600 students, had two classroom buildings and an administration wing, which housed administrative offices, the library, cafeteria, and the health room. This facility was expanded in 1984 and presently consists of an administrative wing, cafeteria, multi-purpose room and three classroom wings.
