- 3. Mt. Pisgah is a Title I Reward School of Performance.
- 4. Mt. Pisgah received a SC Report Card Absolute Rating of Average and Growth Rating of Average.
- 5. Our Professional Development focused on Common Core teaching strategies, PBIS, and Webb's Depth of Knowledge.
- 6. The Achieving Rams Reading Program is used to motivate students to read in Kindergarten and First Grade.
- 7. Mt. Pisgah Elementary completed our Five Year School Renewal Plan (ACT 135). This plan runs from 2013-2018.
- 8. Several programs such as our Fall Festival, Christmas Program, and Valentines Dance were supported by our PTO. These programs allowed for a large number of our community members to participate.
- 9. The implementation of small reading groups allowed for focused reading time for struggling readers at each grade level.
- 10. The use of Learning A to Z, A+, SuccessMaker, and Accelerated Reader allows for individualized instruction and assessment.
- 11. Mt. Pisgah Elementary technology purchases included extra laptops and desktops to update our computer lab.
- 12. The creation of the PBIS store to allow students to shop with their Ram Bucks.
- 13. Partnered with North Central High School to have a Mentoring/Tutoring program. Teacher Cadets were also used to assist in the classroom.
