The mission of Wateree Elementary School, in collaboration with the school's community, is to develop lifelong learners who have the academic, social, physical and character skills necessary to lead productive and successful lives in the 21st Century.

SIC Annual Goals

Goal: During 2008-2013, all professional development plans will be revised yearly to reflect 21st century job requirements.

Result: The SIC reviewed the School Renewal Plan Goals and the professional development offerings at WES designed to address them. Student writing portfolios and reading scores on MAP reflected teachers' successful implementation of best practices in the areas where professional development was provided.

Goal: By 2012-13, students at Wateree Elementary will demonstrate responsibility and accountability through behavior that reinforces respect for themselves and others, reducing student referrals by 10% over the five years (of the School Renewal Plan 2008-2013).

Wateree Elementary School families were very generous in community outreach during 2011-12.
