Palmetto Assessment of State Standards (PASS)

ACT ASPIRE

The ACT Aspire assessment was administered for the 1st time during the 14-15 school year to our 3rd, 4th and 5th grade students. The ACT Aspire test was the first time our students had ever completed a state assessment on the computer. This assessment tested the areas of reading, writing and math.



School Performance:

State and federal Laws require schools to release a report cards to the public each year. This year, the report card has been updated to reflect changes in reporting directed by the SC Education Oversight Committee. Schools will not be rated for state accountability purposes until fall 2017 when the state will transition to a single accountability system.

Additional Information

The 2015-2016 year was outstanding for Doby's Mill Elementary School. Our Title I school continued to meet the responsive academic, social, emotional, and physical needs of our students on a daily basis. DME continued to bond with outside resources to ensure community networking and family support. We are especially proud of our 21st Century LIFE program which worked in tandem with our BE Great program to provide services to over 177 students each day; many of our certified teachers and staff members provided these tutoring services and are credited for the success of this program.

Our faculty and staff consists of highly qualified educators who work hard daily to provided rigorous instruction based on the South Carolina Curriculum Standards. These compassionate individuals devote countless hours to extend the learning after the school day ends. With an enrollment of 563, our students are provided an array of academic and extra-curricular activities beyond the traditional classroom, such as Special Olympics, Safety Patrol, Student Council, Lego Robotics, Archery, Science Fair, Character Education Programs, Yearbook, Lunch Bunch, Brain Sparks, Marathon Kids, Chorus, Junior Achievement, Book Buddies, Doby Dashers, and You Go. Girls. Our students participated in several service projects, including Jump Rope For Heart, Million

Penny Challenge, and Earth8 Recycling efforts.

Through careful data analysis, professional learning committees make changes in instruction in order to meet the needs of our students by setting goals, monitoring student progress, and celebrating student successes. Professional development is offered throughout the year for all staff members to continue their knowledge of best teaching practices and to collaborate with their peers. This year, our focus was on Thinking Maps to respond to Text Dependent questions, the Read2 Succeed requirements, and the KCSD EdTech Challenge.

The continued success of our school requires the support of an involved, vocal School Improvement Council, active PTA volunteers, and generous business partners. Our Dolphins are blessed to have these stakeholders to help them develop into responsible members of society by becoming life-long learners and leaders.

School wide goals for the 2016-2017 will focus on school safety, PBIS initiatives, balanced literacy, Thinking Maps, and enhanced learning through the use of technology.
