

Andrew Jackson High School has an April 2022 enrollment of 615 students and is classified as an AA school. We are the 3rd largest brick and mortar high school in Lancaster County School District.

Our 2021 student population is 72.8% caucasian, 20.6% African-American, 2.2% Hispanic, 3.9% biracial, and <1% Native American/<1% Asian.

Our community strongly supports all efforts at the school-academic, athletic, and the arts. Attendance at events is remarkably higher than typical small schools. This strong support is worth noting. Our ability to provide a wide variety of experiences in this small school setting hinges greatly on community support.
