Our Hands at Work

Hunt Meadows has incorporated Ron Clark's House System as a way to create a deeper sense of family, community and belonging. Students compete for "house points" weekly, and various community service projects help students earn house points.

Hunt Meadows' PTO sponsored a fund raiser, raising over \$25,000. All money stays with the school and funds are used for staff incentives, teacher retention and recruiting, classroom needs, and playground equipment.
