SIC Annual Goals

Goal #1 - PVMS will continue its tradition of excellence by maintaining a Gold Award status through the South Carolina Department of Education's Palmetto Gold and Silver School Awards.

Goal # 2 - All students will increase or exceed the the 50th percentile Conditional Growth on MAP Growth Assessments to 55% by the end of the 2021-2022 school year based on math and ELA results

GOAL # 3 - By June 1, 2022, all ELA and math teachers in collaboration with the PVMS Success Team will develop priority standard units and use formative data to guide instruction and remediation. 100% of the teachers will move from initiation to implementation stage of the PLC continuum.

Student Achievement

Academics:In September, the United States Department of Education made the official announcement that Powdersville Middle School was named a **2021 National Blue Ribbon School of Excellence**. Powdersville Middle is proud to be one of five South Carolina schools and the only middle school in SC to be recognized for this prestigious award.

It is a great honor to inform our parents and community members that Powdersville Middle was recognized as a Palmetto Gold Award-winning middle school. This award demonstrates a school's commitment to excellence and ensuring every student meets the Profile of the South Carolina Graduate. It is designed to recognize schools for attaining high levels of absolute performance, for attaining high rates of growth, and for making substantial progress in closing the achievement gap between disaggregated groups.

Powdersville Middle was again named as a National Beta School of Merit for the 2021-2022 school year. Junior Beta Club is open to students in sixth, seventh, and eighth grades. Members must maintain an average of 85 or higher in all of their classes. Beta Club isn't exclusively about academics, however. The true focus of the club is the community service projects that the members perform.

PVMS Student Council 2021-22 members carried out the theme : *Work Hard to make Wonders* as Our members carried out the theme as they worked very hard to support school and community projects. Our Spirit Week service project was Sock-tober. Our student body donated hundreds of pairs of socks for local childrens' homes in the area.
