Freshman Focus classes have adopted the Laurens Memorial Home. Students have taken Halloween treats, Christmas stockings, and Valentine surprises to residents.


The Raider Spirit Store opened in October. It was constructed by the Building Construction classes at LDHS and sells Raider attire and supplies.
