Student Achievement

During the 2022-2023 school year, Laurens Middle School focused on high-quality instruction to improve student achievement. Students took the Measures of Academic Progress (MAP) test three times throughout the year to measure the progress of their learning. During the 2022-2023 school year, the following gains were made from Fall to Winter according to MAP results:

MAP Reading

- +5.2 average point growth in 6th grade
- +1.9 average point growth in 7th grade
- +3.5 average point growth in 8th grade



MAP Math

- +3.8 average point growth in 6th grade
- +2.7 average point growth in 7th grade
- +3.5 average point growth in 8th grade
