GCO SIC GOALS

Goals for the SIC focused on goals to improve safety, instruction, and accountability with an emphasis on academic recovery.

- **Safety:** Safety and security upgrades to • the campus including adding a handrail to the stairs outside of the second grade hall and placing additional cameras to areas of the building have been added. The building was rekeyed in the Summer of 2020 for safety purposes. The SIC reviewed the District 55 COVID-19 protocol for school campuses. Temperature checks and masks are required upon entry of all students, staff, and visitors. Desks are spaced 3-6 feet apart with partitions on each desk. Hand sanitizer stations and water bottle stations were added throughout the building. An isolation room was added for students with possible COVID-19 exposure.
- **Instruction:** The SIC reviewed steps taken to improve instruction, such as coaching cycles, uninterrupted instructional time, instructional expectations, data analysis during professional learning communities, professional development, and data driven instruction.
- Academic Recovery: The SIC reviewed the Academic Recovery Plan for GCO. Students were able to participate in after school tutoring, the 21st Century After

School Program, or Engage SC. Interventionists began using the "push-in" model in grades K-1. Academic Recovery continues to be a priority, and instructional decisions for additional academic support continue to be made as we continue to monitor progress of our students.

• Accountability: The SIC discussed improvements in student attendance and truancy. The SIC also discussed the use of formative and summative assessments to help monitor student growth and achievement.
