2014 - 2015 Improvement Efforts

- 1. Utilized the Running Records assessment tool to monitor the reading progress of all students throughout the year.
- 2. Created a Science Lab equipped with materials and resources for students to engage in hands-on learning. This room and supplies could be used by all teachers in all subjects to enhance learning.
- 3. GATE enrichment classes were offered during related arts time for each grade level, serving approximately 75 students.
- 4. Utilized MAP (Measure of Academic Progress) to gauge academic growth and to project where students will perform on the PASS test.
- 5. Provided remediation and enrichment for our students through our related arts teachers. Creative scheduling allowed each of these teachers two hours each morning to "push-in" to classrooms and work with our students in the areas of math and reading.
- 6. Utilized a DATA Wall and individual teacher DATA notebooks to track students' progress based on MAP, Star Reader, and other data sources to follow student performance and mastery of standards.
- 7. Provided mobile carts of Chromebooks to enrich classroom learning. Students used the technology to research new topics and practice critical skills.
- Emphasized reading through our Accelerated Reader Program. Students received individual reading goals and were rewarded with incentives for meeting those goals.
- Provided student access to online resources directly related to state standards. This allows students extended teaching and practice at home as well as school.
