School Achievements

- Waterloo Elementary School received an Good rating on the 2023–2024 State Report Card. This was the highest report card score in the district.
- Waterloo Elementary School was named one of five 2025 National Institute for Excellence in Teaching (NIET) Founder's Award finalists.
- Mrs. Anna Freeman, 2nd grade teacher, was chosen as the school's Distinguished Literacy Teacher.
- Waterloo Elementary School was awarded a \$1,000 STEAM grant through Michelin.

Student Achievement
