## CLINTON HIGH SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT PLAN GOALS

- **TEACHER/ADMINISTRATOR QUALITY**
  - By 2025-2026, 90% of our teachers will score "Evident" or "Very Evident" on the Eleot evaluation tool in the domain of "Learners' discussions/dialogues/exchanges with each other and the teacher predominate."
- **STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT**
  - By 2026, 90% of our graduating seniors will be college or career ready as measured by the following: ACT Score - 20, SAT Score - 1020+, AP Exam - 3+, Dual Enrollment - 6+ Hours, WIN Score - Silver 4, ASVAB - 31, CTE Completer - Recognized Credential Internship Work Based Industrial Evaluation - 3+.
  - By 2025-2026, student scores on the end of course tests for Algebra 1 will increase by 1% each year..
  - By 2025-2026, the graduation rate will increase by 1% each year in order to meet and/or exceed the state graduation rate.
  - By 2025-2026, student scores of a C or better will increase by 2% each year on the US History end of course test.
  - By 2025-2026, 50% of students in the subgroup Students with Disabilities will score D or higher on the EOCEP English 2 and EOCEP Algebra 1.
- **SCHOOL CLIMATE**
  - By 2025-2026, there will be a 1% decrease each year in our largest discipline offense which is failure to wear an ID.

## TEST SCORES DATA



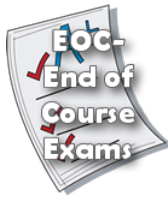
The ACT includes the Composite, English, Reading, Math and Science scores ranging from 1-36.

# CHS DATA

- 4 year graduation rate of **80.8%**.
  - **61.3%** of students from prior year graduating class enrolled in a two or four year college or technical college pursuing an associates degree, certificate, or diploma in Fall following graduation.
  - **66.5%** of CHS teachers have advanced degrees.
  - **66.1%** of graduating seniors are eligible for LIFE scholarship..
  - **535** students are enrolled in Career and Technical Education courses.
  - **60.6%** of students who earn their diploma are considered college or career ready.
  - **76.2%** of tested students received a certificate on ACT Workkeys.

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- CHS offers 15 Varsity Sports competing across 3 seasons.
- All Varsity Sports teams qualified for the SCHSL 3A State Playoffs.
- Facility Upgrades- new track facility, gym floors refinished, new weight room equipment, new digital school sign.
- CLUBS OFFERED- Student Council, Beta Club, NHS, NAHS, MAGE, FCA, YIG, Bass Fishing, HOSA, FFA, Science Olympiad, Rifle Team, BADD and JEWEL, Academic Team, Theater, Gospel Choir, Marching Band, Robotics.
- The Science Olympiad team won its 13th state championship since 2009.
- As one of the smallest schools in the Large School Division, the Academic Team won its 4th consecutive Western Piedmont Educational Consortium (WPEC).
- CHS added Firefighter 1, Firefighter 2 and EMT as an elective with the possibility of receiving a certification.
- Launched a MTSS program targeting behavior improvement and math and English support.
