CLINTON HIGH SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT PLAN GOALS

- **TEACHER/ADMINISTRATOR QUALITY**
 - By 2025-2026, 70% of our teachers will score "Evident" or "Very Evident" on the Eleot evaluation tool in the domain of "Students are actively engaged in the learning activities."
- **STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT**
 - By 2026, 69% of students in our 2022-2023 graduation cohort will be college or career ready as measured by the following: ACT Score - 20, SAT Score - 1020, AP Exam - 3, Dual Enrollment - 6+ Hours, WIN Score - Silver 4, ASVAB - 31, CTE Completer - Recognized Credential Internship Work Based Industrial Evaluation - 3+.
 - By 2025-2026, student scores on the end of course tests for Algebra 1 will meet or exceed state average by 2% each year.
 - By 2025-2026, student scores of a C or better will increase by 2% each year on the US History end of course test.
- **SCHOOL CLIMATE**
 - By 2025-2026, there will be a decrease by 5% in the number of out of school suspensions for the overall student body.

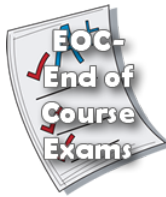
The ACT includes the Composite, English, Reading, Math and Science scores ranging from 1-36.

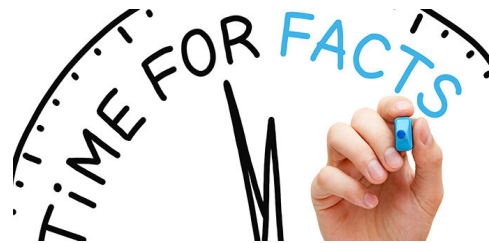

CHS DATA

- 4 year graduation rate of **78.2%**.
- **80.1%** of Clinton High School seniors are eligible for the Life/Palmetto Fellow Scholarship.
- **45.6%** of students are enrolled in dual enrollment courses.
- **80.7%** of Clinton High School 11th/12th grade students enrolled in dual enrollment courses complete at least six hours with a C or better.
- **57.3%** of students are enrolled in Career and Technical Education courses.
- **63.8%** of students who earn their diploma are considered college or career ready.
- **73.6%** of Clinton High teachers have advanced degrees.

- For the 20-21 school year, Districts 56 and 55 partnered to offer the Laurens County Virtual Academy.
- CHS offers 15 Varsity Sports competing across 3 seasons.
- CLUBS OFFERED- Student Council, Beta Club, NHS, NAHS, MAGE, FCA, YIG, Bass Fishing, HOSA, FFA, Science Olympiad, Rifle Team, BADD and JEWEL, Academic Team, Theater, Gospel Choir, Marching Band, Robotics.
- The Science Olympiad team won its 10th state championship since 2009 competing in a new virtual format over 15 other teams.
- As one of the smallest schools in the Large School Division, the Academic Team won its second consecutive Western Piedmont Educational Consortium (WPEC). Since no state championship was held this year, the Academic Team retained its 2020 State Championship.
