Academies, Arts, Athletics

Clinton Middle School prides itself on creating opportunities for every student in our building. A focus on academics, the arts, and athletics allows Clinton Middle School to connect to the needs of the whole student.

Students in the 6th grade are supported academically with a teamed approach that creates a nurturing environment to provide a seamless transition to the middle school environment. Beginning in 7th grade, students are introduced to an environment that blends structure, opportunity, and the freedom needed for a middle school student to grow. In the 8th grade, students have a variety of academic opportunities, including the chance to receive high school credit for classes such as English I, Algebra I, Discovering Computer Science, and PE I. Academics are supported after school at Clinton Middle School through extracurricular opportunities such as the award winning Academic Challenge Team and the Science Olympiad Team.

Students at Clinton Middle School have the chance to participate in a Fine Arts program that matches student talent with a public product. Hugh Pace, Caitlyn Hellman, Amy Link, and Dale Roth combine to showcase the musical and artistic talents of students. The Fine Arts teachers at Clinton Middle School provide a variety of course offerings to students, including Advanced Art courses, General Art courses, Band, Chorus, and Theatre.

Clinton Middle School gives students in grades 7 and 8 the chance to participate in football, volleyball, girls basketball, boys basketball, and cheer. In addition, through Clinton High School, there are opportunities for Clinton Middle School students to be a part of girls tennis, boys tennis, C-team baseball, competitive cheer, JV girls soccer, JV boys soccer, track, cross country, softball, and golf.

Wildeat Academy

Clinton Middle School wants to encourage students to grow beyond what might be presented in a normal curriculum. Our Wildcat Academy served 170 students during the 1st semester and 140 students in the 2nd semester. Wildcat Academy offered 1:1 tutoring in addition to classes such as Cooking with Science, Girls Who Code, Computer Programming, Drum Corps, and various Art classes.



Our Students & Staff

For the 2020-21 year, face-to-face instruction and a virtual academy have been used to reach a student body of 644 students. The nearly 50-50 distribution of males to females includes a student that is 48% Caucasian, 39% African-American, 6.5% biracial, and slightly over 6% Hispanic.

The staff at Clinton Middle School consists of 47 teachers, 98% of whom are fully certified.
