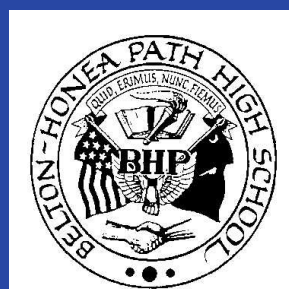

AP Testing: 72 AP students took 108 exams with a 53% passage rate. The highest overall passing rate in 10 years!

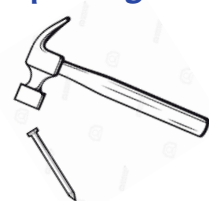

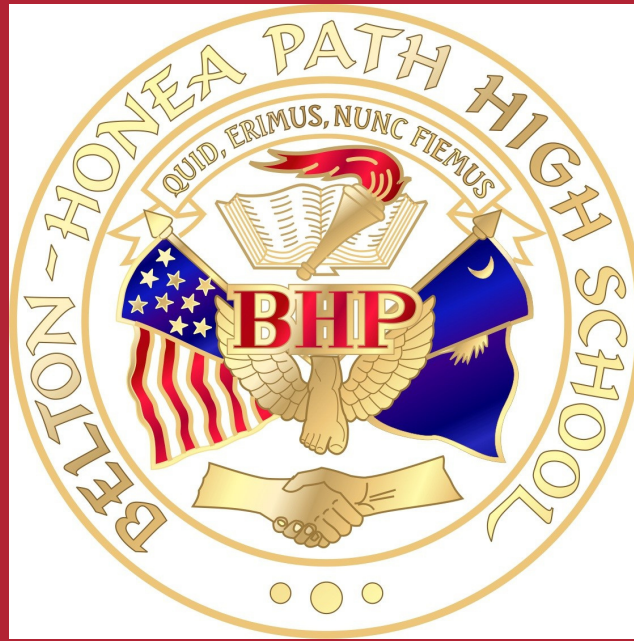
-By May of 2021, BHP will have less than 40% of VLA students failing one or more classes.
