- **4.4 million dollars in scholarships was earned by the Class of 2014.**

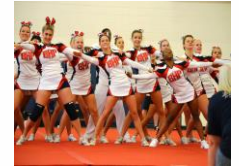


## Athletics

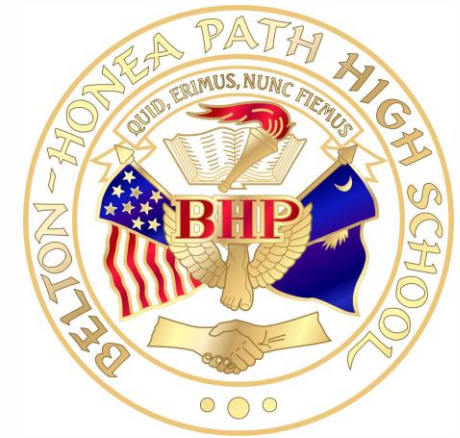
