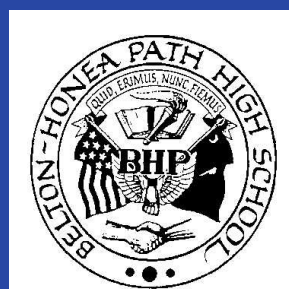

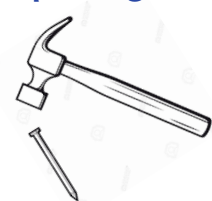

### SIC GOAL

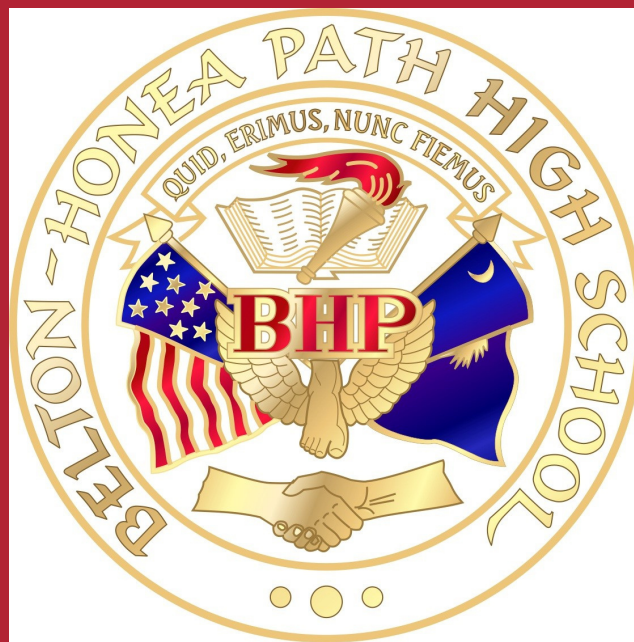
-By May of 2023, BHP will host a parent event with the outcome of increasing communication on student opportunities at the High School.
