

Student Achievement Goals

1. Students scoring met and exemplary in Math as measured by the state assessment will increase from 30.2% to 35.2%. 78% of students taking the Math section of the Measure of Academic Progress (MAP) will increase at least 10 points from fall to spring.
2. Students scoring met and exemplary in ELA as measured by the state assessment will increase from 41.8% to 45%. . Students taking the ELA section of the Measure of Academic Progress (MAP) will increase at least 10 points from fall to spring.
3. Bishopville Primary will increase its prime instructional time from 89.8% to 91.8% as reported by the school report card.
