

School Achievements

Lee County Career and Technology Center was recognized as the educational institution representing the 2019 SC Regional Work-Based Learning Student of the Year and the Technology Champion 2019 for the Santee Lynches Region. Our DECA students attended the 2021 SC DECA Development Conference Virtual Opening Session. The Director of CATE was recognized with the “10 Years of Service” award from DECA. The LCCTC DECA’s Chapter also participated in the DECA Socially Distant Service Project. #DoItForDECA serves as an opportunity for the members and chapters to give back to their communities however they see fit. LCCTC FFA Chapter placed in the top 20 of the state in the Virtual Floriculture CDE and in the top 10 of the Virtual State Nursery Landscape CDE. One student placed in the top 10 for the Pee Dee Region Virtual Creed Speaking Career Development Event. The FFA Organization participated in the #PowerPlantSC on Earth Day and planted 700 pine tree seeds to celebrate this event. The Automotive ASE All Star Competition is held annually for students currently enrolled in the Automotive Programs in South Carolina. One student qualified as one of the top ten students in the state for the hands-on competition at Midlands Technical College. Six students received the ASE Entry Level Certification in Automotive Technology and two automotive students were accepted into the Automotive Technician Apprenticeship Program during the 2019-2020 school year; eight students received the ASE Entry Level Certification in

March of 2021. Two seniors from the Principles of Engineering class competed in the SkillsUSA SC Drone Competition. Both students obtained their Pilot Certification during the 2018-2019 school year while attending the Project Lead the Way Summer Camp sponsored by LCSD. Additionally, sixteen students received the OSHA 10-Hour General Industry Certification in June of 2020. Student certifications have increased over the past three years and non-traditional participation has nearly doubled. Ten students successfully completed the Teacher Cadet Program. Several graduates have pursued careers in the Early Childhood Education field. Eight students are currently enrolled in the Health Science Clinical Study Program and will be eligible to take the National Health Science Assessment Exam and five students are enrolled in the Pharmacology for Medical Careers Program and will be eligible to take the Pharmacy Technician Board Exam (PTCB) in May of 2021. We are proud to announce that 43 seniors were recognized as CATE Completers and 13 dual completers for the 2019-2020 school year. Students participated in the 55th National Career Development Association (NCDA) Poetry and Poster Contest. This year’s theme was “My Future Career: Imagine the Possibilities!” Lee Central High School had two winners at the school/district level. There were 1st, 2nd and 3rd place winners. Lee County School District selected Ms. Octavia Anderson as the 2020-2021 District Teacher of the Year. Currently, Ms. Anderson serves as a Family and Consumer Science Teacher at LCCTC and was recently featured in Diversity Works.

Student Achievement

The percentage of students scoring 60 or above on all End-of-Course Test will increase 25% by the end of 2020-21 as measured by the SC Report Card through Engineering Notebooks, Word problems, research projects, and constructing problems involving key terms from Biology.

Teacher/Administration Quality

Teacher attendance will increase from 96.4% to 100% by the end of 2018-2019 school year and maintain 100% throughout the 2020-2021 school year as measured by the SC State Report Card with an interim goal of increasing by 1% yearly by offering incentives to those who have perfect attendance and also provide teacher recognition when appropriate. By 2021, 100% of teachers will participate in professional development at least once a month based on individual needs as measured by Individual Professional Plans.

Develop a tracking system at the local level to monitor teacher attendance.

CTE teachers will implement strategies to complement the academic success of students taking CTE courses to enhance EOCEP.

According to the 2016-2017 Report Card results, LCCTC's overall performance rating was good. This information was shared with stakeholders at the Spring Advisory/Advisee Meeting Wednesday, May 1, 2019, and at the School Improvement Council Meeting held on Wednesday, August 21, 2019. This year's Advisory/Advisee Fall Meeting was held via Zoom on February 2, 2021.

The VI Perkins Performance Report 2017-18 program updates included newly added course(s) (Intro. to Hospitality and Tourism and Events and Entertainment Management) and obsolete program (Building Construction) that were shared with stakeholders. Computer Science and Fundamentals of Computing were added as CATE electives and the iCEV Online CTE Curriculum and Edgenuity eDynamics Learning courses were added this school year. Stakeholders recommended collaborative planning for CATE instructors with both the high school math and science teachers to help increase the Perkins indicators 1S1 and 1S2 and monitor-based instructional practices aligned to the district curriculum and state standards. Stakeholders shared the importance of adding an Aeronautics Program and partnering with the local airport.

According to the S.C. School Report card, the Improvement ratings from 2017 were Good. "Based on state law, schools and districts will not be rated for school accountability until Fall 2018."

Lee County Career and Technology Center, specializing in specialty programs, serves approximately 465 students in grades 9-12 for each semester: a 110-student enrollment increase from the 2018-2019 school year. A breakdown of the 2019-20 school year is 57.18% are African American males, 39.44% are African American females, 1.41% White males, .99% White females, and .99% Hispanic/Latino students.

Lee County Career and Technology Center has a staff that includes twelve (12) teachers, two guidance counselors and two career specialists that works between the two schools, a secretary, a custodian, and a director.
