

School Achievements

Lee County Career and Technology Center was recognized as the educational institution representing the 2019 SC Regional Work-Based Learning Student of the Year and the Technology Champion 2019 for the Santee Lynch Region. Our DECA students participated in the state competition, with our student earning an 8th place ranking in Public Speaking. One student was awarded a scholarship from Johnson and Wales University Charlotte Campus, Charlotte, North Carolina. LCCTC FFA Chapter placed in the top 10 of the state in the State Floriculture CDE and the State Nursery Landscape CDE. Also, the FFA Chapter earned the National Chapter Superior Award and 100% plus Membership Award. Six students received the ASE Entry Level Certification in Automotive Technology and two Automotive students were accepted into the Automotive Technician Apprenticeship Program. Additionally, one student received the OSHA 10-Hour General Industry Certification. Seven students enrolled in the Foods and Nutrition Program received ServSafe certification. Seven Health Science students received their CPR certification, twelve received First Aid certifications and all twelve passed the National Health Science Assessment Exam. We are proud to announce that 56 students were CATE Completers consisting of 40 seniors, one dual completer and 16 underclassmen.

Student Achievement

The percentage of students scoring 60 or above on all End-of-Course Test will increase 25% by the end of 2020-21 as measured by the SC Report Card through Engineering Notebooks, Word problems, research projects, and constructing problems involving key terms from Biology.

Teacher/Administration Quality

Teacher attendance will increase from 96.4% to 100% by the end of 2018-2019 school year and maintain 100% throughout the 2020-2021 school year as measured by the SC State Report Card with an interim goal of increasing by 1% yearly by offering incentives to those who have perfect attendance and also provide teacher recognition when appropriate. By 2021, 100% of teachers will participate in professional development at least once a month based on individual needs as measured by Individual Professional Plans.

Develop a tracking system at the local level to monitor teacher attendance.

CTE teachers will implement strategies to complement the academic success of students taking CTE courses to enhance EOCEP.

Teacher Assistant for CATE was hired.

According the 2016-2017 Report Card results, LCCTC's overall performance rating was good. This information was shared with stakeholders at the Spring Advisory/Advisee Meeting Wednesday, May 1, 2019, and at the School Improvement Council Meeting held on Wednesday, August 21, 2019. The VI Perkins Performance Report 2017-18 program updates included newly added course(s) (Intro. to Hospitality and Tourism and Events and Entertainment Management) and obsolete programs (Building Construction) were shared with stakeholders. Stakeholders recommended collaborative planning for CATE instructors with both the high school math and science teachers to help increase the Perkins indicators 1S1 and 1S2 and monitor-based instructional practices aligned to the district curriculum and state standards. CATE's Teacher Assistant also provides fifteen minutes of instruction to include a word of the day, numeracy, and literacy across the curriculum. Stakeholders shared the importance of adding an Aeronautics Program and partnering with the local airport.

According to the S.C. School Report card, the Improvement ratings from 2013 through 2017 were Good. "Based on state law, schools and districts will not be rated for school accountability until Fall 2018."

Lee County Career and Technology Center, specializing in specialty programs, serves approximately 710 students in grades 9-12: approximately 355 students for both semesters. A breakdown of the 2018-19 school year is 57.18% are African American males, 39.44% are African American females, 1.41% White males, .99% White females, and .99% Hispanic/Latino students. Lee County Career and Technology Center has a staff that includes thirteen (13) Instructors, a teacher's assistant, a career specialist that works between the two schools, a secretary, a custodian, and a director.
