# **Pelion High School Goals**

# Students On-Track: Increase the percentage of students on track to graduate.

At the end of the 2023-2024 school year, our percentage of students on track to graduate was 72%. At the middle of the 2024-2025 school year, our percentage of students on track to graduate is 74.5%. During the 2023-2024 school year, Pelion High School had three students, in the Senior Class, who were Palmetto Fellows. At the middle of the 2024-2025 school year, Pelion High School has six students, in the Senior Class, who are Palmetto Fellows. To qualify for a Palmetto Fellows Scholarship, a student must earn at least 1200 on the SAT (25 on the ACT), earn a cumulative 3.5 GPA at the end of their junior year and rank in the top 6% of their class at the end of their sophomore or junior year.

**Student Achievement**: Increase the percentage of students who meet or exceed standards (earning a 'C' or higher) on the English 2 EOCEP, on the Algebra 1 EOCEP, on the Biology 1 EOCEP and on the US History and Constitution EOCEP.

At the end of the 2023-2024 school year, Pelion High School had 44% of the students earning a 'C' or higher on their English 2 EOCEP as compared to 41.1% mid-year of the 2024-2025 school year. At the end of the 2023-2024 school year, Pelion High School had 13% of the students earning a 'C' or higher on their Algebra 1 EOCEP as compared to 26.7% mid-year of the 2024-2025 school year. At the end of the 2023-2024 school year, Pelion High School had 14% of students earning a 'C' or higher on their Biology 1 EOCEP, as compared to 52% mid-year of the 2024-2025 school year. At the end of the 2023-2024 school year, Pelion High School had 23% of the students earning a 'C' or higher on their US History and Constitution EOCEP, as compared to 29.9% mid-year of the 2024-2025 school year.

**Student Experience:** Increase student perceptions of teaching and learning as evidenced by a climate pulse check from the middle of the 2024 to the middle of the 2025 school year.

At the middle of the 2024-2025 school year, students completed a pulse-check survey which asked about the Social and Physical environment of the school, the Learning Environment of the school, and their level of Safety at and on the school property. When students were asked if students at our school behave well in class, 61.3% of them somewhat agreed, mostly agreed, or strongly agreed. When asked if students at our school behave well in the hallways, in the cafeteria, and on school property, 69.3% of them somewhat agreed, mostly agreed, or strongly agreed that their classes are challenging. When asked about their teachers' perspective of the learning environment, 81.5% of the students somewhat agreed, mostly agreed, or strongly agreed their teachers want students to understand the learning; not just remember facts. Also, 81.5% of the students agreed that their teachers help them when they don't understand something. In terms of safety, 84.9% of the students somewhat agreed, mostly agreed, or strongly agreed they felt safe at our school before and after hours. When asked if they feel safe at school during the school day, 81.5% of them agreed. When asked if they felt safe going to or coming from our school, 87.6% of the students somewhat agreed, mostly agreed, or strongly agreed, or strongly agreed, or strongly agreed, or strongly agreed.

**Certified Staff Experience:** Increase certified staff perceptions of teaching and learning as evidenced by a climate pulse check from the middle of the 2024 to the middle of the 2025 school year.

Certified staff also completed a pulse check at the middle of the 2024-2025 school year. The questions were in regards to the Instructional Focus, Working Conditions, and Safety at Pelion High School. When asked if the school provides challenging instructional programs for students, 87.5% of the faculty

mostly or strongly agreed. Teachers focusing their instruction on student understanding; not just memorizing facts was 82.5% of mostly or strongly agreeing. Eighty percent of the teachers mostly or strongly agreed that they use student assessment information effectively to set goals and plan instruction. Seventy-five percent of teachers mostly or strongly agreed that they used effective instructional strategies to meet the needs of low-achieving students. When asked about using instructional strategies to meet the needs of academically-gifted students, 80% of the teachers mostly or strongly agreed with the statement. For the working conditions at Pelion High School, 55% of the teachers said students behave well in class and 45% mostly or strongly agreed that students at our school behave well in the hallways, the cafeteria and on school grounds. Of the teachers who took this survey, 87.5% mostly or strongly agreed that the school administration provides effective instructional leadership. On the topic of safety, 92.5% of the teachers agreed they feel safe before and after school hours, as well as during the school day.

# In Summary

Students at Pelion High School have many opportunities for academic support. In the 2023-2024 school year, Biology 1 and Algebra 1 teachers organized and led an Academic Blitz for their content in preparation for the EOCEP in those respective courses. This year, teachers of Algebra I, Biology I, English 2, and US History and Constitution are having an Academic Blitz for their respective EOCEP preparation.

Morning tutoring is available for all math content and afternoon tutoring on Tuesdays and Thursdays is available for all content areas. These tutoring opportunities are free to students, however, they must sign up in advance to participate. Another opportunity for academic success is through our Advisory time on Tuesdays and Thursdays in what we call 'Zap the Zeros'. Two days a week, during Advisory, students are given 35 minutes on those days to work on missing assignments, receive additional help, finish a test, or retake a test.

During the 2023-2024 school year, Pelion High School had one graduation coach who served the entire student population. Beginning in the 2024-2025 school year, we were fortunate enough to have two graduation coaches. One graduation coach serves the 9th and 11th graders, along with that grade level school counselor and another graduation coach serves the 10th and 12th graders, along with that grade level school counselor. These graduation coaches are able to monitor students' progress toward earning their required high school credits and are a valuable part of the students' future success. In addition to the many responsibilities and services our school counselors provide, they, too, work with the students to plan their pathway of courses as they look toward their high school graduation. Another important person on Pelion High School Campus is our career specialist. The roles of the career specialist include, but are not limited to, helping students with becoming CCR (College and Career Ready), preparing for the ASVAB/Career Readiness Assessment, preparing for the driver's education test, coordinating career fairs, helping students find internships, helping students complete internship applications, helping students to prepare a resume, helping students complete college applications and helping students research financial aid opportunities.

Pelion High School offers grade level, honors, AP (Advanced Placement), DE (Dual Enrollment)

courses, in addition to CTE Certifications and JROTC training and experience. There has been an increase in the number of students taking DE (Dual Enrollment) courses since last year. In the 2023-2024 school year, there were 34 students enrolled in courses within the Agriculture, English, History and Math Department. This year, the number of students enrolled in DE courses has increased to 42 students. Pelion High School has also seen an increase in the number of internships since last year. In the 2023-2024 school year, 28 students participated in an internship either on campus or at a community business. This year, the number of students participating in an internship has increased to 63. Pelion High School also experienced an increase in the percentage of students being CCR (College and Career Ready) from 53% in 2024 to 66.4% at midpoint in 2025.

Pelion High School offers many opportunities for students to be involved. Students can participate or support the various athletic programs, participate in clubs once a month, apply for AVID (Advancement via Individual Determination), join FFA (Future Farmers of America), join the LINK Crew, sign up for Broadcasting or Yearbook, serve on the Student Council, participate in various Fine Art Programs, participate in service learning opportunities plus so much more.
