

2015-2016 SIC Report to Parents

It has been an exciting year at Lexington Middle School as we continue to inspire, prepare, and empower our students to make their world a better place. By focusing this year on student-centered learning, we helped our students develop the world-class knowledge, skills and characteristics described by the Profile of the South Carolina Graduate. The students' work paid off in numerous accomplishments and recognition. We are so proud of all of our students this year and confident that they are ready for whatever awaits them beyond LMS.

Our students experience a rich curriculum guided by the South Carolina standards and the International Baccalaureate. Each student participates in a balance of eight academic subject areas. New courses like Communication21 and 702 North Lake – studying the impact of social media, continue to expand opportunities for our students. Our academic performance earned us the state's highest rating, Palmetto Gold, and we also earned Palmetto Silver recognition for Closing the Achievement Gap. Our students qualify for prestigious programs such as Duke Tip, Palmetto Junior Scholars, and the National Beta Club. These measures along with nationally normed data tell us that our students enjoy substantial, continuous growth at our school.

At Lexington Middle, we identify and measure student development in specific skill areas known as Approaches To Learning. Our students apply their skills in school and through their amazing accomplishments in extracurricular activities. Our performing arts ensembles scored Superior ratings in their state evaluations, while our athletic teams made us proud throughout the year. Our cheerleaders were named state champions for middle schools, and our volleyball team went undefeated for the sixth straight season, once again winning the region championship. We added a dance program this year, with introductory classes as well as a highly successful competitive dance company. For the sixteenth consecutive year, our students participated in an international exchange with students from Claremont, France. We take pride in celebrating the whole student at LMS and our kids continue to discover their many amazing talents.

Our mission as a school is driven by the idea that each of our students will be able to make a positive impact on their world. Character education and service is embedded into all we do. We have classroom and school-wide service projects that involve every student. Our LMS Relay For Life team raised over \$20,000 for the fight against cancer. This year for the first time, our eighth graders completed individual inquiry-based community service projects. After researching and selecting a project, students developed and implemented action plans to address an issue in the community. Their presentations to advisors and peers documented their process and provided reflections on their own personal discoveries resulting from the work. Through the projects, they made a positive impact in local senior facilities, animal shelters, charitable organizations, and much more.

We were honored this year to be recognized as a Palmetto's Finest finalist, as well as a TransformSC school, joining a network of schools committed to innovative practices in education. Pride in our students' achievements energizes our efforts and fuels our passion for continuous improvement. Our students are the profile of the South Carolina graduate, guided by a proud faculty and community, towards a future with endless possibilities.
