Relationships matter- our advocacy structures exist for both students and staff and are essential to creating a culture of belongingness at Lexington Middle.

Our student advocacy structure is designed to ensure that every child is well-known by at least one adult. During the 2019–20 school year, we implemented a student advocacy structure two days a week. We had a lot of success and used Advocacy as our major communication structure through the circumstances surrounding Covid-19. During quarantine and throughout 20-21, we used our advocacy leaders to check on students' mental health and create social structures for student social interaction.

This school year, we also added an advocacy structure for our faculty and staff. We began the school year by meeting daily in our "Faculty Families." We believe that starting every day in this structure prioritized the social and emotional well-being of our employees in a time of unique stress. We know that their self-care is an essential part of our students' success.

It is imperative to have structures of support that are effective in creating a culture of well-being and safety for everyone in our building. All these things work together to create a culture of belongingness where everyone is an active contributor. At LMS, everyone matters.
