- Student-led conferences are conducted twice a year. Students explain their goals, both personal and academic, to their parents. They then guide their parents through their progress.
- We are completing our second year as a "Leader in Me" school with a school-wide implementation of Stephen Covey's 7 Habits for Highly Effective People. It emphasizes 21st century leadership skills for all students.
- "The Seven Habits of Successful Families" parent training was offered to all parents in the school as an overview of our school-wide emphasis on 21st century leadership skills for all students.
- The Response to Intervention program continues to assist students who fail to meet grade-level criteria for academic success.
- All students hold either a classroom leadership role or a school leadership role. Sample roles are Safety Patrol, Postmasters, Guidance Assistants, Messenger, Lunch Count Taker, Pencil Sharpener, Supplies Gatherer, Lunchroom Assistants, Ambassadors and Student Council Members.
- SGES purchased technology, such as iPads, iPods and personal GPS devices, to broaden the scope of learning for our students and enhance technology skills they will need as 21st century employees.
- Our three computer labs are open to students before school begins each morning to allow additional time for reinforcement and enrichment of mathematics and reading skills.
- Two STEM labs have been created to promote learning in science and mathematics.
- Special Education Teachers Barbara Jolley and Erin Gagnon received a grant for Special Olympics.
- A student-led morning news program was implemented to keep students and staff informed on current events at the school.
- Our mathematics and literacy coaches facilitate training for teachers on mathematics and literacy curriculum (respectively), offer classroom assistance, and conduct reinforcement and enrichment activities for students.

Awards and Accomplishments

- Saxe Gotha Elementary was awarded with a Palmetto Silver Award because the school's absolute performance rating was above "School At Risk" for the most recent year, and the growth index has been 92.20 or greater for three consecutive years.
- One hundred percent of our students and staff have completed a personal mission statement and 100% of the classes have completed a class mission statement as part of the "Leader in Me" implementation.
- Two Leadership Days were held for students to show educators from across South Carolina and other parts of the United States how students are leaders within Saxe Gotha Elementary.
