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PROGRESS ON SIC GOAL FOR 2023-2024

The 2023-2024 Saxe Gotha Elementary School Improvement Council met throughout the school year and focused on the goal of building community through family engagement events. The first part of our mission is to cultivate a caring community and our efforts this year showed a renewed sense of vigor on building ties between our parents, business partners, local church volunteers, and other community partners. These efforts aligned with our goals of creating a sense of belonging for all children in the school building. With a greater sense of community around our school, our children have more opportunities to create a positive connection with our school, the staff members, and their peers.

Our family engagement plan aimed to provide opportunities for families to engage in learning, social, and fun activities at our school and local businesses. We began our family engagements in the summer with our SGES Spirit Nights at local businesses around the Red Bank & Lexington area. We held five SGES Spirit Nights and received such positive feedback from the local business; they reported that our spirit nights were among the most successful they have had and welcomed us back. SGES Spirit Nights were held at Zaxby's (twice), Groucho's, Marco's Pizza, and Highway 55. Children and families were able to enjoy a meal together outside the school building and build positive relationships.

The next part of our community building plan was to equip parents with the knowledge and tools they need to support their children at home. A new event added this year was SGES Parent University, held in November during American Education Week. At this event, parents were given the opportunity to attend multiple sessions on a variety of topics that aimed to help them advocate for their children and deepen their understanding of the instructional approach and model we use at SGES. We offered sessions on Reading Workshop, Math Workshop, Response to Intervention, School Counseling, and Feedback Driven Progress Reporting (School Report Cards). This event was well received and paired with our spring event, The Shining Star Showcase, held in March. At this event, all of our related arts teachers had grade-levels showcase different projects they completed throughout the school year and held a musical performance by our 4th graders. During the event, we also provided parents with information on SC Ready Testing and the South Carolina Department of Education survey's impact. Providing our parents with the knowledge, tools, and resources to support their children at home was a major success as a part of our community building goal.

At our Grandparents Breakfast, we invited grandparents in for a meal with their grandchild and then provided them with resources and tips to help enrich the literary lives of their grandchildren. We followed that event with our Pastries with Parents event that invited parents in for a sweet treat with their child and provided them with resources and tips to help their children grow in mathematics. Both events were well attended with a lot of positive feedback.

Mentoring is another large part of our school's focus and bringing in community members to provide opportunities for students to build positive relationships with the community was a major success. We partnered with Mid-Carolina Electric Cooperative and each week they sent volunteers to engage children in fun activities related to science and engineering but also built positive relationships with the children through fun activities like baseball and basketball. We continued our relationship with USC hosting the "Tall Teachers, Small Teachers" program to provide learning experiences during Reading and Writing Workshops. USC students worked individually with students to observe students' reading and writing habits, reflect on these observations, and plan specific instruction. Members of Covenant Community Church and Lexington Church of God came to our school weekly to read to our 2nd grade students and, in conjunction with our Literacy Coach, worked in small groups with children on their reading skills. We capped off our community events with our Read Across America Week Read-in and invited school leaders and community members to read a book to our children related to our theme "One Dream: A Constellation of Stellar Readers." All of our children were able to have a community member come to their classroom to share their love of reading.

Finally, we partnered with our PTA to provide the fun events that children and families love each year. We held two drive-in style SGES Movie Nights. Children and families were able to park in our bus loop and we had a large screen on the roof of the building. PTA Bingo Night was another highly requested night that did not disappoint and Family Game Night was filled with joy as parents and children played board games and card games together.

Our School Improvement Council's goal of engaging the community and building our community relationships was a resounding success. The students and staff at Saxe Gotha Elementary School are so thankful for the support the community shows in the lives of our children.
