#### **PROGRESS ON GOAL FOR 2019-2020**

GOAL: Foster a school environment that welcomes and engages all families

During the 2019-2020 year, SGES focused on creating a more welcoming and engaging environment for our students, parents, and community members. Several steps were taken during the year to move this goal forward.

School-wide use of Bloomz was a priority because giving parents and teachers a means to communicate is essential to their engagement. We were able to communicate directly from the school level by purchasing a premium subscription. Throughout the COVID-19 Pandemic, Bloomz became an anchor for many stakeholders in our school community.

During the year we also held several events and provided many opportunities for our stakeholders to engage with our school family. Our Little Stars program provided an opportunity to reach parents by sharing early learning activities to use with their children before they even enroll at SGES. Parents and their preschool aged children engaged in activities to help the children develop as learners. An additional support system to encourage engagement between school and home is our Parent Resource Center, which is available to all parents.

Another event held during the year was our "Night of the Living Books" Literacy Event. The goal was to bring books to life for our students. The night began with a performance by our first grade students. We then had a special performance by teachers who acted out the book Room on the Broom. For the rest of the evening, families spent time together on a scavenger hunt across the entire school. They had to find hidden letters all over the school in order to determine a secret message.

SGES also hosted Family Learning Events which allowed parents to participate in workshops led by our Literacy Coach and Parent Liaison. These events introduced the reading and writing workshop model to parents and gave them ideas to assist their children at home. The absolute BEST thing about these events is that families were able to visit their child's classroom to actually see the workshop model in action. They were able to learn alongside their child.

We also held several End-of-Unit Celebrations this year. These celebrations were so much fun to host! At the end of a reading or writing unit, entire grade levels were able to showcase their hard work to parents and guardians. Grade levels hosted these events in their own special way. Most grade levels had families come into their classrooms for the celebration. Prior to each celebration, family members were provided with essential information about the workshop model, information about the unit of study their child had been working on for several weeks, as well as helpful tips and handouts (such as the writing checklists or special anchor charts) that they could use at home with their children.

All of these events this year assisted our school in fostering a school environment that welcomes and engages all families.
