Student Achievement Goal

By 2011-2012, 86% of students will score met or above on the State assessment in each of the four core content areas (Language Arts, Math, Science, Social Studies).

Update on Progress Toward Goal

During the 2010-2011 school year, 72.2% of students had reached the goal in Language Arts, 70.7% in Math, 77.6% in Science, and 71.2% in Social Studies, and 65.1% in Writing.

By 2010-11, our professional development plan will be revised and fully implemented to meet the performance goals of the School Improvement Plan

Update on Progress

As of the 2010-2011 school year:

- All administrators have received training in the Southern Regional Education Board's Creating a High Performance Learning Culture.
- The school's Data Team develops school goals and meets regularly to discuss progress toward those goals.
- The school has implemented the ELA and math numeracy models.
- The school has set aside Mondays for professional development, faculty meetings, and department meetings.
- The faculty participates in collaborative planning days established by the school district.

Update on Progress

As of the 2010-2011 school year, GMS has conducted family nights and parent conferences. School/home communication forms include monthly newsletters, a website, a phone messaging system, as well as grade reports. The school also has developed a volunteer program. The PTO and SIC groups meet monthly to discuss school issues and to include parents in the decision making process. The SIC sponsored a math night as well as quarterly student recognition programs.
