FLEXIBLE TEACHING

This year our staff has done an amazing job teaching in a variety of platforms. TECHNOLOGY

We have been very fortunate this year to be one to one for all of our students. Our K-2nd grade students used iPADS and our 3rd-5th grade students used Chromebooks. As a school, we utilized Google Classroom as a platform to manage student and teacher communication. In addition to teachers having access to devices, all of our Instructional Assistant were given iPADS as well so they could also participate in Zoom meetings with students and hold breakout sessions for small group support.

SOCIAL AND EMOTIONAL LEARNING

This year, especially, we have focused intently on our students' social and emotional well being. SEL is a process in which students acquire and apply the knowledge, skills, and attitudes to develop healthy identities, manage emotions and achieve personal and collective goals, feel and show empathy for others, establish and maintain supportive relationships, and make responsible and caring decisions. To begin each day, a school wide time was observed for individual check ins with students as well as morning meetings to build relationships.

ACADEMIC ASSESSMENT INDICATORS

Lake Murray students are usually assessed using the SCReady and SCPASS, which align to the state academic standards. Due to the COVID-19, we did not proceed with state testing for grades 3rd-grades 5th. Therefore, this area is not completed.
