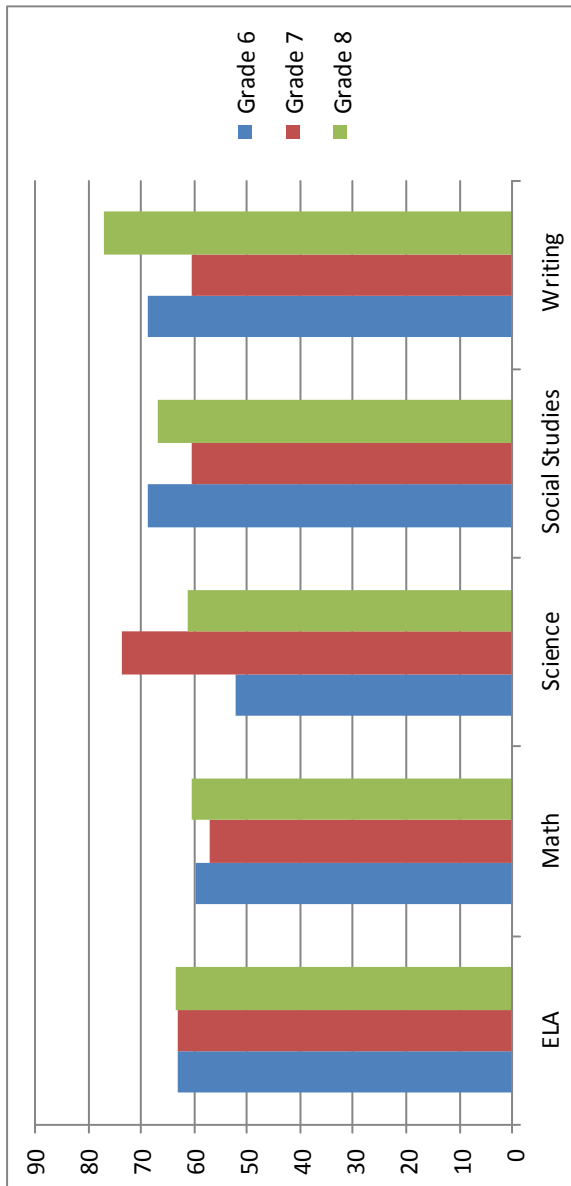

We are proud that ...

- Six Eighth graders qualified as Junior Scholars.
- Twenty-one Seventh graders were qualified to participate in the Duke TIP Scholars Talent Identification Program.
- Three students were selected to participate in the Orchestra Tri-DAC summer program for 2014. Six orchestra students were selected to be members of the Lexington District One honors orchestra.
- Six choral students auditioned for the State Middle School Honor Choir.
- Pelion Middle School Honor Band earned an excellent rating at the South Carolina State Concert Performance Festival.
- The Pelion Middle Performing Arts Center is days away from completion. It houses a 500 seat auditorium and two new classrooms.
- Shelly Martin is representing PMS as the 2013-14 PMS Teacher of the Year.
- Three teachers have qualified for National Board Certification.
- Shelly Martin's and Tanya Warsheski's classrooms were selected by the district to film for district professional development videos.
- Suzanne Peterson is serving as secretary for the 2013-14 SC Council of Teachers of Mathematics. She also helped conduct statewide Teaching Fellows interviews.



Innovative School Programs

Students participate in service learning projects including a food drive, a fundraiser for Cystic Fibrosis and for Relay for Life.

Focus on Learning and Tech Tuesdays are teacher led professional development sessions that meet once a month to build technology and literacy skills among our faculty.

High School credits are offered in Algebra I, English I, Latin I and Spanish I.

We will be hosting a Spring Academic and Arts festival on April 29. This celebration of learning will feature activities and performances from all subject areas.

The 2013-14 school year featured a flexible scheduling model that made it much easier to serve the needs of individual students.

Response to Intervention programs serving students struggling academically in reading and math have shown tremendous success.

Our teachers have been using Edgenuity, an online learning platform, to create units for re-teaching grade-level standards.

Our teachers are reading and studying 7 habits of Highly Effective People in an effort to increase leadership capacity among faculty and students.
