Initiatives and Strategies

- The Leader in Me Program PHMS has been a Leader in Me School since 2016.
- Arts in Basic Curriculum (ABC) Advancement Grant PHMS uses a grant provided by the South Carolina Arts Commission to enhance the school's Arts focus
- World Language Students can receive high school credit for Spanish, French, or German beginning in the 7th grade.
- World Language Immersion Programs PHMS offers Spanish and German Immersion programs. Students take two classes in the target language for the year: Language Arts and Passport to the Speaking World.
- STAR 360 This testing program is used in the Fall and Winter to determine students' skill levels in reading and math and monitor learning growth.
- Professional Learning Teachers meet weekly to receive training for testing, analyze data, and explore new initiatives. During the 2020-21 school year, professional learning focused on digital learning resources, using data for small group instruction, and student engagement and relationships.
- Extra Help Opportunities Students were able to receive extra help before school, during virtual office hours and on virtual Fridays.
- **Intervention Teams** Teachers work with a coordinator to identify and monitor students with interventions to ensure student success.
- Common Assessments & Planning Teachers collaborate regularly to develop common assessments and instructional activities.
- Hybrid Learning Students and teachers began the 2020-21 school year
 with a Hybrid Learning model, where students learned face-to-face two
 days and virtually three days each week. As the year progressed, students
 slowly transitioned to face-to-face instruction five days a week.
- **PTSA** Parents, students, and staff work together to raise money, support programs, initiatives, and student participation.
- Read Across America Day To support literacy and celebrate Read Across America Day on March 2, 2021, students and staff dropped everything and read during lunch and Advocacy.
