Initiatives and Strategies

- The Leader in Me Program PHMS has been a Leader in Me School since 2016
- Arts in Basic Curriculum (ABC) Advancement Grant PHMS uses a grant provided by the South Carolina Arts Commission to enhance the school's Arts focus.
- World Language Students can receive high school credit for Spanish, French, or German beginning in the 7th grade.
- World Language Immersion Programs PHMS offers Spanish and German Immersion programs. Students take two classes in the target language for the year: Language Arts and Passport to the Speaking World.
- Where Everybody Belongs (WEB) Program A middle school transition program is in place to train 8th graders to be mentors to incoming 6th grade students.
- PHMS Ambassador and Cougar Companion Program Students are selected to serve as spokespersons, give tours, and provide support to new students and visitors.
- Character Development Center (CDC) The name of the In School Suspension (ISS) room was changed to CDC. Restorative practices will be used to help students reflect on their behaviors and repair their situations.
- STAR 360 This testing program is used in the Fall and Winter to determine students' skill levels in reading and math.
- **Professional Learning** Teachers meet regularly with administrators in the "Think Tank" to discuss methodologies, receive training, analyze STAR 360 data, and explore new initiatives.
- Extra Help Opportunities Students can receive extra help through the Tier II ELA and MATH Intervention push-in model, ILT time, extra help sessions before, during, and after school, and additional time for enrichment make-up, and/or re-do during the school day.
- **Intervention Teams** Teachers work with a coordinator to identify and monitor students with interventions to ensure student success.
- Common Assessments & Planning Teachers collaborate regularly to develop common assessments and instructional activities.
