STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT

Despite student achievement not being summatively measured at the end of the 2019-2020 school year by the state of South Carolina, students demonstrated mastery of knowledge and baseline skills through the administration of the STAR Renaissance Learning Assessment. Our faculty focused on better aligning skills that were not easily addressed in a remote learning in the Spring of 2020 in conjunction with this data to make decisions for student learning in the 2020-2021 school year.
