STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT

Our faculty continued to focus on vertically aligning skill gaps, developing short cycle common assessments, and providing targeted intervention to address specific school needs.

SCHOOL & FACULTY ACHIEVEMENTS

Fulmer Middle School is proud to be redesignated for the third time as a National School to Watch by the National Forum to Accelerate Middle Grades Reform. This designation is for high-performing middle grades schools who demonstrate academic excellence, developmental responsiveness or meeting the unique needs of adolescent learners, a socially equitable learning environment, and having organizational structures that guide school functioning.

In March 2023, Fulmer Middle School was designated as a Model Professional Learning Community at Work by Solution Tree, Inc. We are nationally recognized as a school that is responsive to academic growth for all students in her school community with specific commendations in the areas of special education, multilingual learning, and academic achievement for economically disadvantaged students. Fulmer is currently 1 of 5 schools in South Carolina and 1 of 444 schools in the United States with this designation.

Fulmer Middle School continues to remain an active member of the Professional Development Schools Network with the University of South Carolina. Despite pandemic restrictions, Fulmer maintained an active partnership through our support of early career teachers, student ownership in learning at the middle level, and clinical experiences for teacher candidates.
