Student Achievement Goals

By 2022... The percent of 2nd grade students scoring at or above the 40th National Percentile Rank (NPR) in math as measured by spring Star scores will increase from 57.1% to at least 75.0%.

The percent of students in grades 3-8 scoring at or above the Meets Expectation level on the SC Ready math assessment will increase from 35.3% to at least 65.0%.

By 2022... The percent of 2nd grade students scoring at or above the 40th National Percentile Rank (NPR) in reading as measured by spring Star scores will increase from 51% to at least 75%.

The percent of students in grades 3-5 scoring at or above the Meets Expectation level on the SC Ready ELA assessment will increase from 27.8% to at least 58.0%.

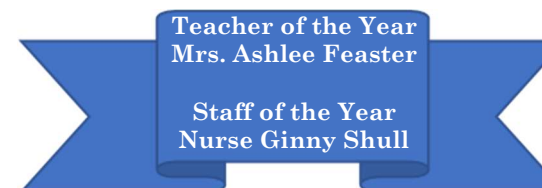

What is Student Improvement Council (SIC)?

An SIC is a broad-based body intended to advise the principal and school, and is focused on helping to achieve school improvement. State law requires that every K-12 public school in South Carolina convene an SIC. The law states that it is the responsibility of the local school board to ensure SICs are constituted within each district. This includes career, vocational, and technical schools. Public charter schools may convene an SIC but it is not required by law.
