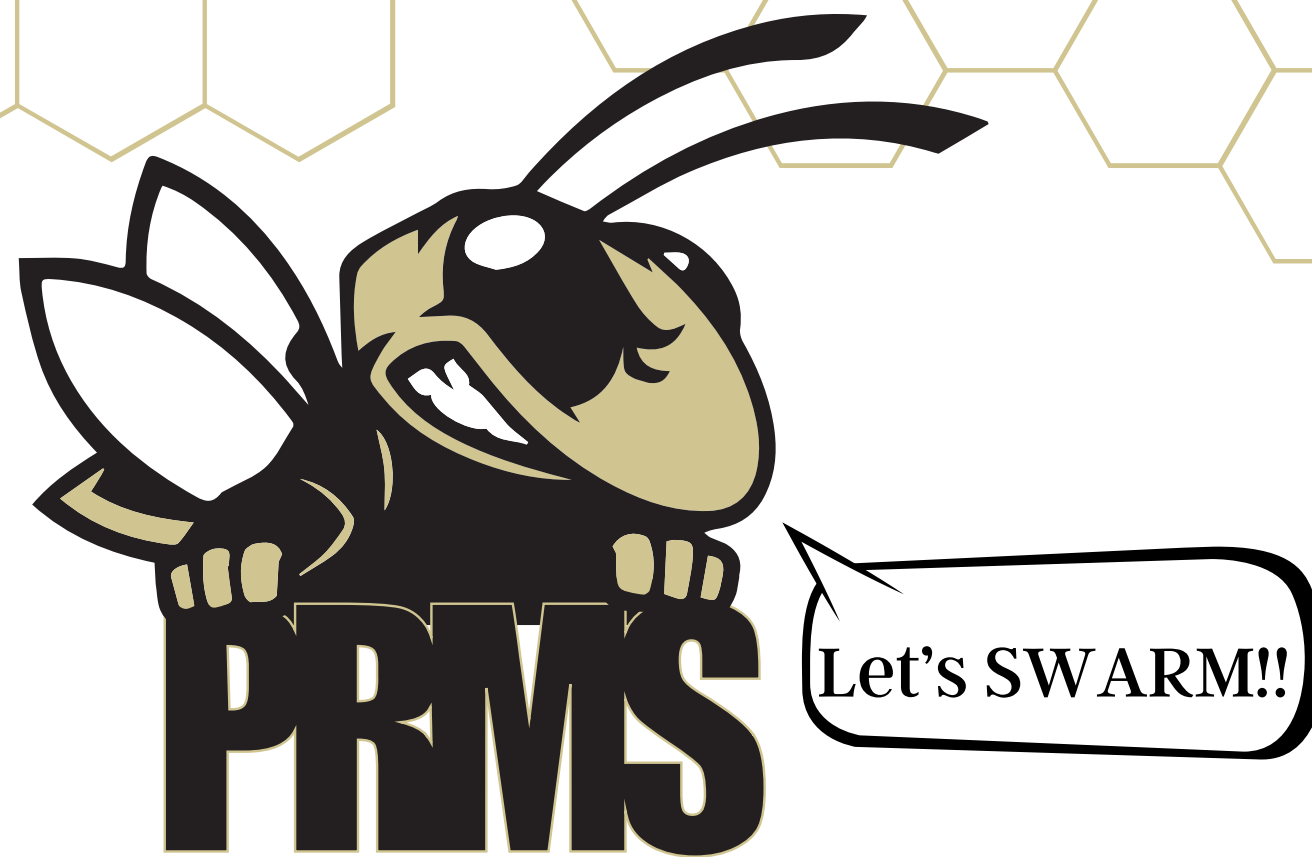

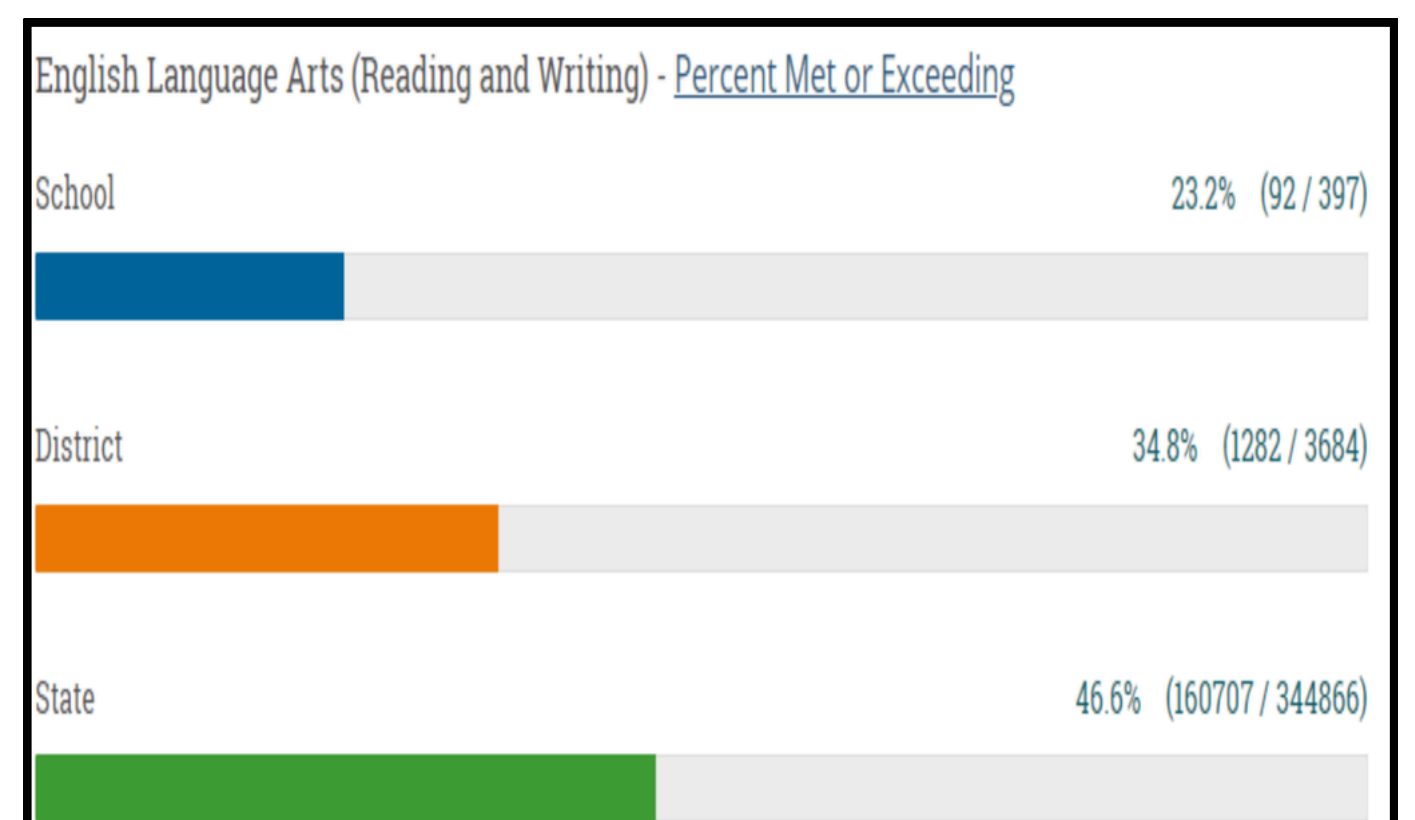
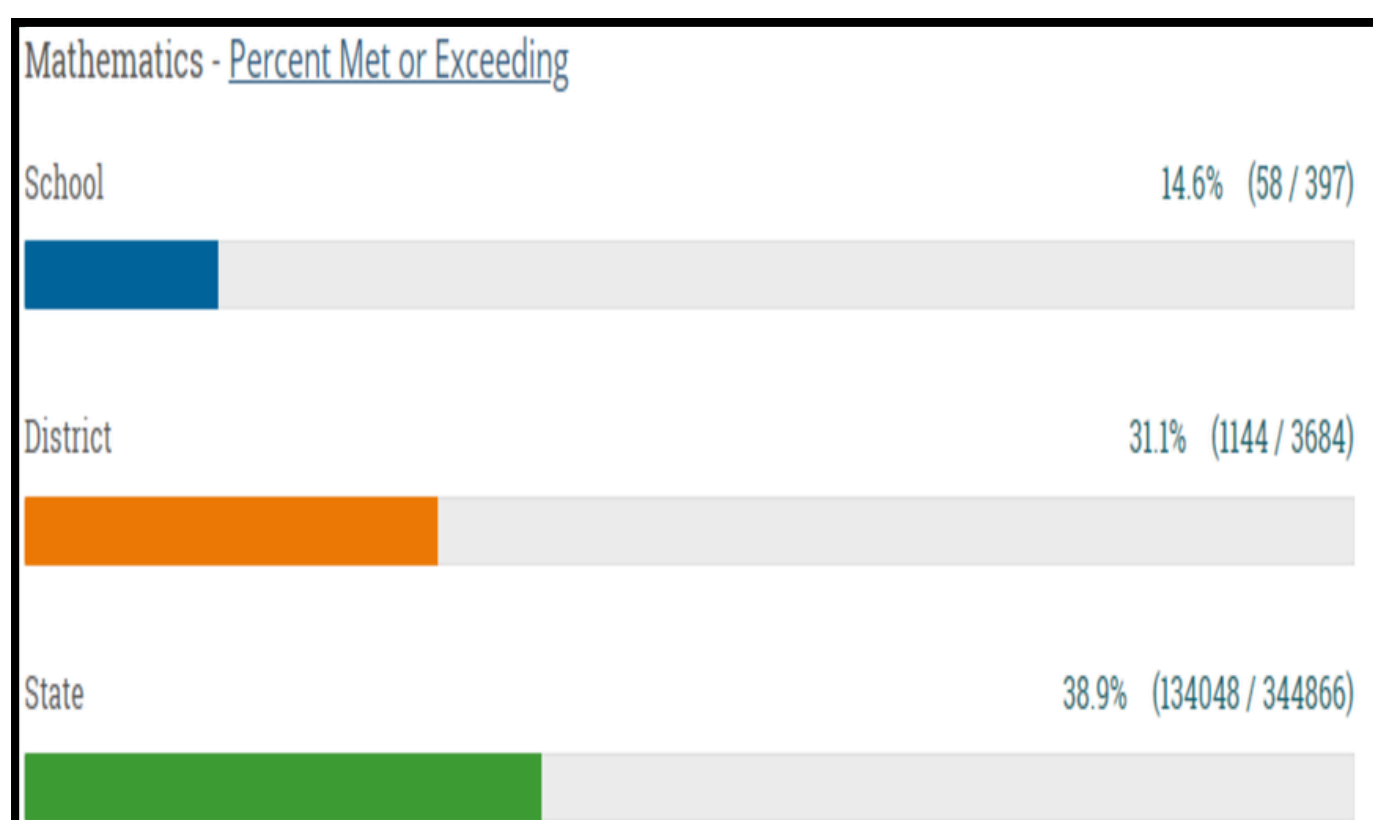

STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT

This year we have used the PLC process to focus on Student Achievement. At PRMS, we focus on student achievement and filling gaps in student learning through our daily Tier II STING intervention time and in our after-school Lex2.5 program. We monitored student growth and mastery of knowledge through the administration of the STAR Renaissance Learning Assessment and Common Formative Assessments in the classroom. Not only did we focus on student academic achievement, but on social and emotional learning as well through specific SEL curriculum and through the skills of our School Counselor, Social Worker and Community in Schools Site Coordinator. At PRMS, we believe that the whole child is valued and every aspect of our students is important. Our student achievement for the 2022-23 school is outlined below for English Language Arts and Math.

Our annual goals include the following areas:

- SC Ready/ELA The percentage of students in grades 6-8 scoring at or above the Meets Expectations on the SC Ready ELA assessment will increase by 3.8 percentage points each academic year, resulting in growth from 23.1% to 41.8% by June 2027.
- SC Ready - Math The percent of students in grades 6-8 scoring at or above the Meets Expectation level on the SC Ready Math assessment will increase by 3.8 percentage points each academic year, resulting in growth from 14.1% - 33% by June 2027.
- Multilingual learners (MLLs) who demonstrate annual progress towards the proficiency target in English will increase by 2 percentage points each academic year, resulting in a 10 percentage point increase from 32% to 42% by June of 2026.
- By June of 2026, school report card surveys will show an increase in the percentage of parents satisfied that their child is safe at school will increase from 76.65 to 86.6%.
