- 4. Provide effective special education, academic assistance, remedial programs, and alternative programs for students in need of those services.
- 5. Provide APEX Learning Courses and virtual school courses for credit recovery, academic enrichment, and the alternative program.
- 6. Promote and encourage literacy across the entire curriculum through a variety of instructional strategies.
- Expand the use of technology in the classrooms and continue system upgrades.
- 8. Continue to upgrade and expand CATE courses and programs to ensure they promote 21st century skills and challenge students to excel.
- 9. Provide relevant and meaningful professional development opportunities for teachers that directly impact and influence student achievement.
- 10. Maintain frequent communication with parents and stakeholders through a variety of means.
- 11. Ensure continuity across courses by having teachers adopt common syllabi, common assessments, curriculum maps, and grading practices aligned to the new Common Core State Standards.
- 12. Continue the artist-in-residence program.
- 13. Include character education in the classroom and in all extra-curricular programs.
- 14. Provide an effective Advisor-Advisee program.
- 15. Continue to offer a variety of co-curricular activities that recognize many student interests, talents, and abilities.
