Principal's Message

Welcome to Batesburg-Leesville Elementary School! I was so honored to be named the principal of Batesburg-Leesville Elementary School last year and am excited to share just a few of the amazing things happening at our school.

At BLES, we work hard to promote a culture of perseverance, work ethic, and belief in ourselves and each other. You may notice students wearing lanyards with pins and talking about clipping up on the behavior chart. Students have an opportunity to earn Panther PRIDE tickets on a daily basis which they can use to earn lanyards and pins. PRIDE is an acronym that stands for the following:

<u>E</u>nthusiasm

Through this system, we firmly believe that we are addressing the skills that students need to be successful now and in the workforce later in life!

You may see students engaged in 'Panther time' throughout the day. Our "Panther Time' differentiation blocks for ELA and Math are built into the day to provide opportunities for students to receive small group instruction, one-on-one instruction, and to calbalorate with their pees. Technology is often integrated into learning stations at this time. Our students can hardly wait for "Panther time" each day! This also allows us to serve the needs of our students through Gifted and Talented, Response to Intervention (RTI), and Special Needs. This is truly a time where students' learning is personalized based on their strengths and areas for growth.

This year, we continued our Personalized Learning initiative through flexible grouping, flexible seating, learner pathways, learner profiles, and continuing the use of data notebooks throughout our school. Our teachers immersed themselves in the areas of personalized learning to grow professionally and provide our students with structures that make learning more meaningful. Teachers also embraced the idea of Growth Mindset as we continue to create a community of learners that don't give up and persevere through learning new and difficult content.

Our Arts program continued to make huge strides through our Related Arts classes, Honors Choir, Annie Jr. Production, and dance partnerships. Through grant monies, we were able to provide students with numerous choices in the arts and expose them to new experiences such as drama, ukuleles, and amazing visual arts projects.

Finally, we started the beginning phase of our Panther College program. This program was designed to give students opportunities to explore different career options at a young age. It is my belief that we must begin exposing students to careers and having conversations about their interest in careers at a young age to foster goal setting within the child. Through Panther College and the help of community volunteers, students were able to choose courses in the areas of electrical engineering, coding, agricultural business and science, photography, nursing, drama, turf grass management, HVAC, and journalism. Renewal Plan Goals

- By 2035, 90% of students will score a level two or higher on SC Ready by creating a more rigorous classroom environment and increasing support for at -risk students. By 2023, the percentage will increase from 74.2% to 79.5%.
- By 2035, 70% of English learners will achieve annual progress in English by the end of the 5th year in the EL program through supports for English leaners. By 2023, the percentage will increase from 31% to 44%.
- By 2023, the percent of stakeholders satisfied with the social and physical environment on the EOC survey will increase by 1.5 percentage points a year to 95% for parents and 100% for teachers through facility upgrades and meeting students' social needs.

Lexington School District Three recently completed an external review process with AdvancED and received above the network average scores. The District and Batesburg Leesville Elementary School are fully accredited through AdvancED. As part of the process, the School Renewal Plan was updated.
