Principal's Message

This year. Lexington School District Three continued the academic priorities that emphasized rigor, collaboration, and engagement in every area of our instructional program. Our curriculum was aligned with State Standards to adequately prepare our students to be both college and career ready. Our school goals support the state-wide effort in implementing 21st Century Learning. In order to accomplish this, each week our teachers have worked collaboratively to coordinate, plan, and reflect on best practices in the classroom. Additionally, all teachers were formally evaluated under a district-wide performance goal emphasizing literacy skills, formative assessments, technology, and data analysis.

Our school offered a wide range of activities. Our sixth grade teachers hosted a summer transition camp to provide opportunities for students to transition smoothly into a new school environment. The Junior Beta Club and Student Council both sponsored a variety of activities for our students to provide positive middle school experiences. 2011-16 School Renewal Plan Goals
