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The mission of Honea Path Middle School, in collaboration with the total community, is to inspire lifelong learners who apply the knowledge, skills, and attitudes necessary to become creative problem solvers, achieve personal success, and contribute responsibly as citizens in our diverse and dynamic world.

School Renewal Plan Goals

Student Achievement Goal – By 2020, 85% of students in grades 6-8 will meet grade-level expectations on state-wide assessments.

Teacher Quality Goal – By 2020, teachers will, on average, participate in 17 days of high quality professional development that focuses on increasing teachers' expertise in using engaging instructional strategies, motivating learners, and creating quality assessments aligned to district goals as evidenced by professional development days on the state report card.

School Climate Goal #1 – Through 2020, the average student attendance will remain at or above 96%.

School Climate Goal #2 – By 2020, the average teacher attendance will remain at or above 98%.

The purpose of the School Renewal Plans Annual goals is to steadily progress the school forward in all areas consistent with the school's mission. We believe that by targeting the above four areas that we will not only prepare our students for the high school, but that we will have helped to shape a generation of students for success in our community.

Student Achievement

HPMS students scored higher than other schools statewide with students like ours in Reading, Writing and Math on the ACT Aspire test.

HPMS students at all grade levels scored higher than the statewide average in both Science and Social Studies on the SC PASS test.

41.5% of all students scored Exemplary on Social Studies PASS.

31.7% of 8th grade students scored Exemplary on 8th grade Science PASS.

36% of all 7th and 8th graders are enrolled in a high school credit bearing course.

100% of Algebra I and English I students passed the state's End-of-Course Exams.

40 of our 8th grade students earned a high school credit for foreign language in 2015-16.

Ashlyn Haynie was accepted into the SC Governor's School for the Arts and Humanities in the area of Music - Clarinet

HPMS Unique Attributes

21st Century Merit Academy – HPMS has a thriving afterschool program with a STEM focus.

Focus on Service Learning – Nearly 150 of our 300 students take Service Learning as an elective and HPMS offers Gold, Silver, and Bronze awards based on the National Service Learning Standards.

Earn Carnegie Units - Students are encouraged to get a jump on high school coursework with the opportunity to earn 3 high school credits in 8th grade (Algebra I, English I, and Spanish).

Gateway to Technology Program offers courses in Design & Modeling, Automation & Robotics, Introduction to Computer Science and will be adding Electronics next year!

Digital Library - our library offers over 375 titles for digital download on your student's e-reader device.

Technology rich school - Our building is fully wireless, each student has a chromebook for 1:1 instruction, has two 3D printers, and offers two 30 station iPad mini mobile labs. Students are engaged in their learning and often generate rich projects for public consumption.
