## 2011-2016 <br> School Goals

End of School Year mean RIT scores on the Measures of Progress (MAP) testing in reading and math will increase to the $60^{\text {th }}$ percentile or higher by 2016.

The percentage of $1^{\text {st }}$ and $2^{\text {nd }}$ grade students scoring at grade level on the Developmental Reading Assessment (DRA) will increase to $67 \%$ for $1^{\text {st }}$ and $65 \%$ for $2^{\text {nd }}$ by 2016.

By 2016, $98 \%$ of parents will participate in at least one parent conference with school personnel each year to discuss their child's progress.

Discipline referrals will decrease by $20 \%$ by 2016 .

By 2016 the percentage of teachers who indicate satisfaction in response to the Education Oversight Committee School Climate Surveys will increase to $100 \%$.
