School Priorities for 2011-2012

In our efforts to provide the most beneficial educational experiences for our students, our 2011-12 focus will be on further development of unit plans with embedded formative assessments and common summative assessments. Teachers will continue to plan together to create and implement these units and to analyze the information they receive from the assessments.

We will continue to provide support for students through our enrichment program, targeting those who require academic intervention in reading and math, with a daily 45 minute support class. Teachers meet periodically to assess student progress and to ensure that students are receiving the needed services.

Literacy will be a focus of instruction as we conduct benchmark writing assessments and continue to build our students' writing portfolios. Students will again be challenged to complete a reading passport to fulfill their meeding.


