LEAD

- Students LEAD through participating and representing SMS in specific PAWS classes (PAWS stands for PBIS, Advisement, Well-informed, and Service). Some of these PAWS classes are specialized to include school clubs.
- Our newly formed Color Guard Drill Team are our guardians of the colors. They formally raise the flag each morning, and carry and post colors for assemblies and parades all while learning how to be a LEADer.
- Teachers LEAD by ensuring a positive, proactive learning environment, reinforcing school-wide, consistent expectations, and modeling life, career and citizenship characteristics.

LEARN

- At SMS, our teachers are dedicated to continuous LEARNing through participating and collaborating with one another in their Professional Learning Communities.
- We want our students to acquire self-determination in order to seek out and use resources to achieve LEARNing. During our TIGER Time intervention period we strive to guide our students in OWNING all their learning and actions (the good and the bad)
 embracing truth- so they grow into the most honest version of themselves.

SERVE

- Our students, staff and our community begin each year with a back to school clean up day. In August we trimmed trees and bushes, weeded gardens and put out fresh pine straw.
- In September, we invited local First Responders to honor them during our 9/11 remembrance.
- In December, our School Improvement Council sponsored our first annual Community Tree Lighting Ceremony which featured free food, live music, caroling, giveaways, and of course the tree lighting and a visit from Santa.
- During the tree lighting we dedicated the Gaston Blessing Box, donated by our award winning Beta Club. The giving box gives our community the opportunity to donate and receive books and non-perishable food items year around.

EXCEL

- In November, we collaborated with The Swansea High Freshman Academy and SHS to host our first annual Lexington 4
 Spanish Spelling Bee.
- Our students were recognized recently in our first semester Awards Assemblies where we honored hundreds of students who have EXCELed in Academics, Attendance and the Arts.
- We also EXCEL by offering three High School Credit courses for those students who demonstrate academic aptitude. These courses include English 1, Algebra 1 and Fundamentals of Computing.
- We have four students who EXCELed in this year's PSAT exam and earned recognition in the SC Junior Scholars program which identifies eighth-grade students with exceptional academic talent.

Athletic Highlights

SMS students EXCEL in multiple athletic teams here at SMS and at Swansea HS. Here at SMS we field teams for Cheerleading, Volleyball, Football and boys and girls Basketball and compete in the highly competitive Lex Ten Middle School Athletic Conference. Additionally many SMS students participate in Cross Country, Golf, Baseball, Softball, Track and Soccer at Swansea High School.



• Sandhills Middle School was the first middle school in South Carolina to be recognized as a Special Olympics Unified Champion School. As a Unified Champion School we EXCEL by providing classroom and community experiences that ensure that all students are valued and cared for. We take pride in the school climate that we have worked hard for here. It is one of respect and tolerance for all students and, more specifically, those with intellectual disabilities. This is seen through our unified Physical Education class, participation in the End the R Word Rally at the State House, and participation in Special Olympics local and state games.
