Disciplinary Literacy



SMS has continued to develop our knowledge of effective literacy strategies across all contents. Utilizing the CCSS Anchor Standards for Literacy in the Technical Subjects, our teachers have increased the amount and complexity of the non-fiction text required in all content areas. In addition,

students have routinely been engaged in argumentative literacy in all classes through dialogue and written forms. Our team has measured our planning and implementation of strategies on a weekly basis and has shared practices with each other throughout the year.

Inquiring Minds: Reading to Learn and Innovate in Mathematics & Science (IQ-MS Research Project)

This year SMS was one of 10 middle schools in SC to be chosen to participate in a research project conducted by the SC Coalition of Mathematics and Science. Our math and science teachers worked collaboratively with an instructional coach and teachers from other schools to understand the importance of disciplinary literacy in the science and math curriculum. Weekly coaching sessions, videotaped lessons, and monthly state-wide virtual meetings were all tools our teachers used to increase our understanding and skills.

EFFECTIVE INSTRUCTION

SMS teachers and administration are joining with our colleagues throughout Lexington District Four in using the different phases of instruction as a tool to enhance our classroom instruction. Through the strategic focus of the phases of instruction, students become responsible for their own learning through the gradual release of responsibility and the gradual increase in the cognitive level expected of students. Our teachers have spent 2012-13 focusing on the effective implementation of collaborative learning and precision guided learning for students in need of assistance.

Phases of Instruction

- Focus Lesson: Teachers explain and model specific content.
- Guided Learning: Teachers provide targeted assistance.
- Collaborative Learning: Students experiment and learn together.
- Independent Learning: Students show individual mastery.

<u>Rigorous Performance Tasks</u>



The Common Core State Standards require students to perform and demonstrate their mastery of content through engagement in performance tasks that include non-fiction texts, multi-media, and argumentative writing. Our team has worked collaboratively to plan and implement these rigorous performance tasks in all content areas during the spring of 2013.
