Purpose Statement

Our purpose is to lay the foundation for students to be college, career, and citizenship ready by honoring their diverse needs. We will accomplish this in an environment where risk-taking and interests are honored.

Sandhills Primary: A TransformSC School

Sandhills Primary was chosen as an innovative site for TransformSC, an initiative of The SC Council on Competitiveness. This organization of business leaders is partnering with educators in selected schools across South Carolina who are striving to ensure that students transition successfully from elementary, middle, and high school to graduate and be college, career and citizenship ready. In October 2016, Sandhills Primary classrooms hosted business leaders, legislators, and the State Superintendent of Education to share our teaching practices on a state-wide bus tour of innovation. The faculty and staff of SPS are proud to represent the district in this initiative.

PALS

Promoting: Achievement, Learning, and Success

PALS is our parenting program offered once per month as a way to build community with families and school, and to grow understanding of parenting strategies and school curriculum. PALS provides quality time for families to spend with their children in a learning experience based upon the goal of the session. Each family is given a book to add to their home library.

Montessori Curriculum- School Choice

At present, twenty two teachers are trained, or are currently being trained in the Montessori Method. Montessori is a hands-on approach to individualized learning in a prepared environment where the teacher facilitates and scaffolds individual needs. Students and parents have the choice to stay with their Montessori teacher for two years, thus providing continuity in learning and the opportunity to forge strong relationships.

The Seven Habits of Happy Kids

Our children use the Seven Habits in their everyday lives. This initiative teaches 21st century leadership and life skills to students and creates a culture of student empowerment. The vocabulary of the Seven Habits helps us in our lives in any setting. Our families also study the Seven Habits in monthly PALS workshops and how they can use these habits of mind at home.



















21st century After School and Summer Program

In 2016, SPS was awarded a \$500,000 federal grant over four years to host an after school and summer program for sixty students needing extra time and support to be successful students. Our program has seen huge success in our students' academic achievement. We also host family nights four times per year to share community and literacy information with our families.

Instructional Coach

Students and teachers interact with the literacy coach in all curriculum areas with an emphasis on the reading and writing process. The coach shares and models 'best practices' with teachers and students.

Professional Learning Communities

Faculty and staff meet in study groups and collaborative planning teams in our quest to increase our knowledge of how young children learn. We take a scholarly approach to our studies in order to increase student achievement. Our focus this school year has been on the reading and writing process. Our staff is also studying strategies to be a trauma-informed school.

Student Goal-Setting and Student Led Conferences

In April 2017, Sandhills Primary hosted parents for student-led conferences. During student-led conferences, teachers act as facilitators as students review their work and progress with their parents. Often students work from a portfolio filled with assignments they have collected before the conference. Some teachers also provide checklists of items for students to cover during the conference or a rough "script" for them to follow.

In January 2017, students completed a self-evaluation, including a list of strengths and areas on which they needed to improve. During the student-led conferences, they updated their parents and teacher as to where they are in meeting their academic goals. This has been a rewarding experience for children, teachers, and parents. School staff seek to use this as a means to improve home school communication and to provide students an opportunity to learn more effectively.

School Improvement Council

SIC (School Improvement Council) assists in determining the strengths and weaknesses of our school and develops strategies to meet new challenges.

School Priorities for 2018-2019

- Continue to strengthen home-school communication through student led conferences, Learning at the Hands of the Children nights, parent surveys, newsletters, school website, phone calls, use of the internet and PALS.
- Continue to enhance our purposeful Inquiry/Project Based Learning studies.
- Increase through scholarly professional study our understanding of 21st Century Skills and how to support these skills within the primary school setting.
- Continue to participate in TransformSC as we seek to prepare our environment with the goal of preparing students for learning at ever higher levels.
