### Spotlight on Excellence

#### **Excellence in Academics**

- SAT and ACT scores exceeded the national average and were the highest SAT scores in the Midlands.
- Our students had an overall 64% pass rate on AP exams.

#### Special School Programs

Advanced Placement & Dual Credit Courses, Individual Graduation Plans implemented for all students, Academic Leadership Academy, Navy JROTC, Career Shadowing, Project Lead The Way (PLTW) Pre-Engineering, Service learning, Student of the Month (character traits), SAIL program, Teacher Cadet, SAT Summer workshops, JV and Varsity SAT teams, SAT and ACT workshops during school year, Academic Banquet, Annual Golden Eagle Evening for area senior citizens, Annual Veterans' Breakfast, Holiday Giving Assembly.

#### Improvement of Academic Programs

Chapin High School has made great progress improving academic programs over the past six years. Following the philosophy of High Schools that Work, we have implemented strategies to help eliminate on-grade level classes and increase expectations for all students. Data Teams were implemented to study student progress and intervene to ensure that appropriate progress is being made. By incorporating instructional practices that promote more student engagement and increased rigor, all students are more challenged and performing at a higher level as indicated in our data. Last year, Chapin High School administered the highest number of Advanced Placement (AP) exams in the school's history. We have also added strategies to identify those students who may not have previously been involved with Honors or AP courses, but have demonstrated AP potential.

#### Academic Leadership Academy

CHS launched the first Freshman class in the selective Academic Leadership Academy (ALA). This program combines AP coursework and iPad technology with instruction in leadership skills to allow students to influence positive change in their community. A new ALA coordinator was named, along with establishment of more rigorous participation requirements and development of the Science Technology Engineering Arts and Math (STEAM) and Humanities tracks.

#### SAIL Freshman Academic Extension

At Chapin High School, we recognize that many students fall into the dimension of "at-risk" for not reaching their potential. Therefore, we have the SAIL (Success Acquired in Learning) program to provide assistance to all "at-risk" students. The SAIL Program, coordinated by Dick Hiller, grew from an after school book club to a school-wide program that includes a new school-within-a-school for freshmen and sophomores. The SAIL program provides academic support using research-based instructional strategies, technology infused classrooms, and specially trained teachers to better meet the needs of students as they transition into high school. These classrooms provide rigorous instruction with high-order-thinking skills encouraged and valued, coupled with extensive, direct academic assistance, so all students can be successful in an advanced curriculum. By using High Schools That Work Key Practices and the South Carolina Department of Education At-Risk Recommendations, SAIL helps provide rigorous, engaging curriculum to all students while advocating that all students get the support they need to be successful. SAIL is showing excellent results. In 2010-2011, 96% of SAIL students were promoted from 9th to 10th grade. 96% of SAIL 10th graders passed the HSAP, and 100% passed the Algebra 1 EOC.

#### Our Students

CHS educated approximately 1300 students in 2010-2011, with a 99% attendance rate. 36% were served by the Gifted and Talented program. 61% enrolled in AP programs. Our school motto, "We aRe Chapin," focuses on students being Ready to learn, Responsible, and having Respect for others.

#### SIC Focuses on Challenges

Chapin High School's staff, students, and SIC persevered amidst the challenging conditions of its physical campus. Bringing the facility which is being operated above capacity up to 21st century standards has been an integral part of the SIC's efforts this year. It has battled legal challenges which have delayed and increased the cost of much-needed renovations. Students, staff, SIC, and the community have rallied to support building efforts at District Board meetings and in the legal arena. Despite these challenges, our results show that we continue to excel, even under less-than-ideal conditions. CHS held a long-awaited groundbreaking ceremony in December 2011, and is currently in the midst of renovations. We look forward to the new campus.

The lack of an on-campus performing arts venue with appropriate seating, acoustics, and lighting for our Fine Arts performances is an ongoing challenge, given that 40% of the student body is involved in the performing arts. Construction work has eliminated a practice field, resulting in difficulties accommodating athletics and NJROTC. In February 2012, the SIC presented a resolution to the District Five board requesting a Fine Arts facility and Artificial Turf Field on site.
