The International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma Programme, the IB Careerrelated Programme, Advanced Placement courses, and Dual Enrollment opportunities continue to challenge

<u>ARTS</u>

Irmo High School is an arts-focused school with options for experiences in vocal and instrumental music, dance, theatre, and many disciplines of visual arts. Each program has various course levels to include any students who want to participate, as well as specialized instruction within each program such as world percussion, piano, technical theatre production, stained glass, and ceramic arts to name just a few. Our highly trained teachers, practice facilities, and Center for the Arts provide our students with a world class environment for arts education and production.

<u>ATTITUDE</u>

Our message to students is one of cohesion and community: "IRMO means I Respect Myself and Others!" and "This is Irmo, where we bring our A Game to all we do!" Our student Irmo Ambassadors are positive peer influencers - they welcome new students, participate in community outreach, serve as peer mentors, and more. Our Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS) program allows teachers to reinforce positive school culture as well as behaviors we expect of our students. To promote student involvement, our PBIS team partnered with Irmo Athletics to provide free admission to an athletic event for students meeting PBIS goals. students academically and prepare them for future success. Teachers utilize a variety of instructional strategies, such as cooperative learning, to actively engage students and encourage them to become lifelong learners. Professional development for teachers included training in cooperative learning, arts-based education, and diversity inclusion from experts in these fields.

ATTENDANCE

Our intentional focus of encouraging students to be in class on time every day is a part of our daily messaging. In collaboration with our school counseling department and social worker, we provide support to families to communicate the importance and connection of attendance and academic success. In addition to academic attendance, we encourage students to participate in extracurricular opportunities and to support one another by attending school events such as athletics, theatre, and more.

ATHLETICS

Irmo High School offers a wide variety of competitive athletic opportunities for both boys and girls. In conjunction with Irmo Middle School, there are Varsity, Junior Varsity, and C-Team levels for many teams. This past year, our students participated in baseball, cheer, cross country, football, golf, lacrosse, soccer, softball, swim, tennis, track and field, volleyball, and wrestling. Our Girls Varsity Basketball coach surpassed 400 career wins, was named County Coach of the Year, and was selected to coach an all-star SC team. Our Girls Golf coach was named Region Coach of the year. First place region champion teams include our Boys and Girls Varsity Basketball teams and Girls Cross Country team.
